## Bell of Two Friends: a 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Gift in need of Repairs MISCA Fundraising Campaign Has a \$2000 Matching Grant Sponsor!

The "Bell of Two Friends" monument sits on Nicollet Island just southeast of the Nicollet Island Inn. It was a gift from the City of Ibaraki in celebration of the twentieth anniversary of the sister city relationship.

Unfortunately Minnesota winters are taking a toll on the monument. The BOTF was constructed mainly of pre-cast concrete and is experiencing cracking due to the freeze thaw cycles of a typical Minnesota winter.

Although the cracks are small at this time – if nothing is done they will gradually get larger, resulting in pieces of the monument falling off.

The city of Minneapolis has again asked for and received estimates for needed repairs from the same conservator who repaired cracking ten years ago. Estimates to repair the cracking are approximately \$9000.

The city of Minneapolis itself is unable to pay for the repairs – so the Minneapolis Ibaraki Sister City Association has undertaken a fundraising campaign to raise the repairs needed for current repairs as well as future repairs.

So far \$4000 has been raised.

MISCA has reached out to Business and Art groups, but they are not in a financial position at this time to help out.

However, Mr. Michael Rainville has graciously agreed to match the next \$2000 in contributions received by June 15<sup>th</sup> – that means any donation that members of MISCA give would be essentially doubled and put us very close to funding we need.

So if possible could you please contribute to the repairs for the "Bell of Two Friends" – even a \$25 contribution becomes \$50.

#### Did you know?

The Bell of Two Friends has a bell inside that can be rung after walking under the arch. However the cord to ring the bell tends to disappear if left in place, so it is only put in when MISCA holds celebrations around the bell: the annual Cherry Tree Festival and Sister Cities Days.
