# Bill Deef – 2020 Mondale Award Recipient

Bill Deef was recognized as the 2020 Mondale Award Recipient on Friday, November 13 at the JASM Mondale Award and Scholarship Gala.

The Gala was held virtually this year due to restrictions on gatherings as a result of the Covid epidemic.

Bill has been a big help to the Minneapolis Ibaraki Sister City Association since the 1980s; helping to coordinate visits between the two cities – especially meeting between city officials, helping with events such as the Haiku Contest Ceremony, the Cherry Tree Festival, the Aquatennial Parade and Sister Cities day. Bill has worked for Meet Minneapolis (the city conventions and visitor's association) since 1987 and is currently the Senior VP for Public Affairs. His primary responsibilities are to work with the Sister Cities programs (Minneapolis has twelve sister cities) and other public affairs initiatives.

Bill was also a member of JASM for many years, serving on their board of directors from 1994 to 2004 and as its President from 1999 to 2000.

#### The Kinetic and Sound Sculpture at the Ibaraki City Hall

If you have the chance to visit Ibaraki City hall you will find another piece of artwork in the lobby. Unlike other sculptures, this one actually moves and plays sounds!

Titled "Sound Bridge" it was built and designed by Norman Andersen another Minneapolis artist. It uses an electrically powered motor to move the discs and produce the sounds.

Norman Andersen was an instructor for many years at the Minneapolis College of Art and Design. He has been designing electric sound sculptures for over forty years at his studio in Minneapolis. He also designs outdoor kinetic and sound sculptures at his other studio in Baldwin, Wisconsin.

Norman has sculptures displayed around the United States (for example "Rainmaker's Baggage" at Seattle Tacoma Airport), Canada and Europe.

## About the Mondale Award

The Mondale Award was first presented to Walter and Joan Mondale by the Japan America Society of Minnesota in November of 1997. As you can see it is named after its first recipients. Walter Mondale was a U.S. Senator for Minnesota, Vice-President of the United States and Ambassador to Japan. Joan Mondale was a patron of the arts and accomplished potter. During her time in Japan, she promoted understanding through art, redecorated the embassy with works from American artists and organized tours with a bi-lingual guide.

Every year JASM presents the Mondale Award to an individual or organization to recognize outstanding contributions to the building of understanding, cooperation and respect between the people of Japan and Minnesota.

#### 2021 Haiku Contest

Thank you to all the Minneapolis students and staff who sent in haikus for this year's Haiku Contest.

MISCA received over five hundred haiku submissions on the theme "Hope"!

MISCA board members have completed their judging of the haikus and have selected what they feel are the thirty best entries in each of the different categories; K-5, 6 - 8, 9 - 12 and adult.

These haikus have now been sent to Ibaraki City for final judging where they will select eight winners in each category.

MISCA is planning to hold an Awards Ceremony in April 2021, with a date to be determined. If restrictions relax, we hope to hold an in-person ceremony – if not we will again hold a ceremony via zoom, that will be lived streamed to MISCA's Facebook page.
